Course Description:

This training covers both practical and theoretical components of body piercing procedures, including infection prevention in skin penetration and performing piercings. The practical aspect of the course allows you to bring models to pierce. This ensures you have the best possible chance to succeed. Extra practical days can be booked at an additional cost. These are not usually required.

You will learn the skills and knowledge required to maintain infection prevention during skin penetration treatments and to review clinic compliance with the applicable state or territory and local council requirements.

It requires the ability to identify, manage and control infection risks to clients, self, and work colleagues.

This unit applies to individuals who make independent treatment decisions.

The skills in this unit must be applied in accordance with Commonwealth and State/Territory legislation, Australian/New Zealand standards and industry codes of practice.

Entry requirement: Nil. Eze Training recommends participants hold a current First Aid Certificate

Pre-requisites: Nil

Course content: The course covers the theory and practice associated with:

The ability to perform 20 Upper Body Piercings, have an in-depth knowledge of piercing names, placements and appropriate jewellery and perform cannula needle piercing techniques within a sterilised environment

- Comply with infection control regulations and guidelines and related legal obligations.
- Monitor hygiene of premises.
- Maintain infection control for skin penetration treatments
- Sterilise equipment and maintain steriliser
- Maintain awareness of clinic design for control of infection risks.

Delivery mode: face to face

Duration: This three-day course (from 10.00am to 6.00pm)

Commitment level required:

- Independent study
- Work placement or simulated workplace activities
- Research and projects
- Preparation of assessment tasks

Length of time to complete: Most students take anywhere between 1 to 3 months. The time it takes varies with your level of education, skill level, and your ability to put time aside to study.

Career and Study Pathways:

Equipment:

This course includes all materials to enable you to successfully complete the Body Piercing Workshop with hands-on training in a working environment

Typical assessments might include: integrated the maintenance of infection control with skin penetration technical skills that individually or in combination demonstrate:

- identification of potential cross contamination risks, protecting self and client from infection risks
- choosing and using the appropriate cleaning, disinfection and sterilising procedures for instruments, equipment and equipment attachments and work surfaces
- use of correct steriliser operation procedures:
 - packaging of items
 - loading
 - monitoring
 - validation
 - calibration
 - documentation requirements
 - disposing of waste and sharps
- provided a written review of workplace compliance with relevant state or territory and local council laws, regulations, and requirements for skin penetration treatments.
- Australian standards AS/NZS4815 and 4187 relating to infection control in office-based health care facilities
- relevant state or territory legislation and guidelines relating to infection control procedures for skin penetration treatments
- local council requirements for businesses offering skin penetration treatments
- organisational policy and procedures relating to infection control
- legal responsibilities in relation to infection control, sterilising, registration, or business licensing, conduct of occupation, and maintenance of premises relevant to role
- standard and additional precautions as defined by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC)
- industry codes of practice
- aetiology of infection
- sources of infection and means of transmission
- risk management in relation to infection control
- procedures and practices that support infection control measures and prevent infection transmission
- cleaning, disinfection, and sterilising procedures
- procedures for responding to spills
- needle stick or sharps injury procedures for notification and response
- impact of premises layout and workflow on infection control risks
- manufacturer instructions in relation to cleaning, disinfecting and sterilising equipment and products
- risk management process for identifying treatment infection control risks
- workplace infection control risks.
