Course Description:

This course is for workers who may be required to provide a first aid response in a range of situations, including community and workplace settings.

You will learn how to respond in an emergency, apply appropriate first aid procedures, communicate details of the incident and evaluate your own performance.

When you finish this course, you can undertake further First Aid training in other first aid related occupational courses. Advanced standing may be granted in courses where providing first aid in a workplace is a part of the course.

Specific licensing /regulatory requirements relating to this competency, including requirements for refresher training should be obtained from the relevant national/state/territory Work Health and Safety Regulatory Authorities.

Entry requirement: Nil

Please note: If you are seeking to enrol in a First Aid unit of competency you are advised that to complete the unit you must be able to perform basic life support skills, for example, control bleeding and perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). If you have a disability that would prevent you from performing required basic life support skills, you are advised that you will not be able to achieve the unit of competency

Pre-requisites: Nil

Course content:

Respond to an emergency

Apply appropriate first aid procedures

Communicate details of the incident

Evaluate the incident and own performance

Delivery mode: Face to face and online

Duration: 1-day face to face training. You will be asked to successfully complete online assignments before attending the one-day training

Commitment level required: You will be required to be assessed in a practical observation and online component assessment.

Length of time to complete: Most students take anywhere between 1 week to 3months to complete. The time it takes varies with your level of education, skill level, and your ability to put time aside to study.

Career and Study Pathways: You will be able to work in a first aid role in a range of community organisation and industry workplaces

The expiry date of Course: This course is live for 6 months.

If your expiry date is reached and you have not completed the coursework, or an extension has not been granted, you will have to re-enrol at the full price to complete the course.

Other relevant information: The onerous is on the student to research the course thoroughly and ask questions before enrolment and paying the deposit.

Equipment:

You will need to have access to a computer that has an inbuilt web camera or software for an external web camera and microphone to complete online assessment tasks. Google Chrome is also required when completing your online assessments

Typical assessments might include: There must be evidence that the candidate has completed the following tasks in line with state/territory regulations, first aid codes of practice, Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) guidelines and workplace procedures:

- Followed DRSABCD in line with ARC guidelines, including:
 - performed at least 2 minutes of uninterrupted single rescuer cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) (5 cycles of both compressions and ventilations) on an adult resuscitation manikin placed on the floor
 - performed at least 2 minutes of uninterrupted single rescuer CPR (5 cycles both compressions and ventilations) on an infant resuscitation manikin placed on a firm surface
 - responded appropriately in the event of regurgitation or vomiting
 - managed the unconscious breathing casualty
 - followed single rescue procedure, including the demonstration of a rotation of operators with minimal interruptions to compressions
 - followed the prompts of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED)
- Responded to at least two simulated first aid scenarios contextualised to the candidate's workplace/community setting, including:
 - conducted a visual and verbal assessment of the casualty
 - demonstrated safe manual handling techniques
 - post-incident debriefs and evaluation
 - provided an accurate verbal or written report of the incident
- Applied first aid procedures for the following:
 - allergic reaction
 - anaphylaxis
 - bleeding control
 - choking and airway obstruction
 - envenomation, using pressure immobilisation
 - fractures, sprains, and strains, using arm slings, roller bandages or other appropriate immobilisation techniques
 - respiratory distress, including asthma
 - shock
